Recently the Supreme court issued two rulings. One places a fine of \$100,000 a day on the Legislature (and ultimately taxpayers) for what the court views is a failure to adequately fund education. This is despite the fact that since the Majority Coalition Caucus began leading the Senate in 2013, the Legislature has invested \$4.5 billion more in education. Education spending now makes up nearly half of the state's budget. This ruling is concerning in that I believe the court has overstepped its authority.
