

The Stevens County Sheriff has seized 255 dogs from and treatment. Nearly all the animals were suffering from some medical malady or another. One animal humanely destroyed.

The county does not have the resources to deal with and will receive more supplemental reports as the a problem of this size, but thankfully, we are not alone. Literally dozens of volunteers from several agencies and groups are helping. They are caring for the animals and making plans to assist in finding suitable place for these dogs.
